A note from your CEO

When I last wrote to you at the end of March, we were just beginning to see the impact of COVID-19. At Food Share, we knew that the demand for food was going to increase, but to what extent and for how long was hard to predict. Five months later, and it's clear our worst case estimates were not over-blown. Since April 1, we've distributed in excess of 140,000 disaster relief boxes at more than 130 pop-up, drive-thru pantries, serving more than 500,000 people in our community.

People like Leah, 5, featured on our cover, and pictured right, with her mom, Esmerelda, who've been coming to our Friday distributions in Santa Paula to collect a box of pantry staples like rice, oatmeal and pasta sauce, and a bag of fresh fruit and veggies. "It's really helpful, I use everything in the box, and my kids love the fresh apples," says Esmerelda, who lost her job in March, and has three more children at home.

Leah and Esmerelda are just two of the new faces of food insecurity we're seeing in our county. And though the world is taking its first tentative steps towards reopening, we know that it will be a very long time before we can expect full economic recovery. Food insecurity is now the new normal for roughly 115,000 of our friends and neighbors.

The reality is, there's no short-term fix. We're in this for the long-haul, which is why I'm hoping we can

We've expanded!

In response to dramatically increased levels of food insecurity, Food Share has expanded its operations through a generous donation of a temporary lease of a 37,000 sq foot warehouse in Oxnard, CA.

The addition of the new space is thanks to Lawrence Joss, owner of Surfaces USA, who has provided the warehouse at no cost while the building is on the market to be sold. The 146th Airlift Wing of the CA Air National Guard provided key logistical support to Food Share staff during the move to help set up the new space for the packing of emergency food boxes.

"We were bursting at the seams trying to store and distribute the additional food we've had to bring in to meet the current level of need," commented Monica White, President & CEO of Food Share.



"Since the COVID-19 pandemic started, we've increased the amount of food we purchase a month from \$50,000 to \$300,000."

Volunteers at Food Share have been busily packing 23,000 "kitchen-free" food bags to be distributed to unhoused people living in the community.

The bags contain food items that Food Share has purchased after consultation with homelessness advocates to ensure that they best meet the needs of the population. A huge effort has been made to ensure that the bags contain only items like pop top chicken salad, crackers, apple sauce, peanut butter, nuts, and dried fruit that are tasty and nutritious, but suitable for people with limited access to a kitchen or kitchen tools.

The food is being packed into 23,000 reusable bags, which are being distributed to people living without housing or in motels, via Food Share's partner agencies and food pantries including Spirit of Santa Paula, Catholic Charities — Ventura, Community Action, The Salvation Army, The Samaritan Center and Help of Ojai.

OVER 4 MILLION POUNDS OF FRESH PRODUCE DISTRIBUTED DURING COVID RESPONSE

Since mid-May, Food Share of Ventura County has provided a staggering 4.1 million pounds of fresh produce to people experiencing hunger in the county.

The scale of food insecurity in Ventura County has nearly doubled since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. Current projections from Feeding America show that 115,000 people, including 42,000 children in our County, are now facing a daily struggle to access enough nutritious food.

The fresh produce is a result of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's "Farmers to Families Food Box Program." Oxnard-based wholesale produce distributor, The Berry Man, was approved to deliver the first 3.6 million dollars of a 14.7 million dollar contract to provide fresh fruits and vegetables to nonprofits throughout the Tri-Counties Area. The majority of the produce is locally-grown.

Commenting on the impact of the Farmers to Families Food Box Program on people in the community, Roseanne Hernandez, Community Market Coordinator at Community Action of Ventura County, one of Food Share's network of pantry partners said, "The Berry Man boxes have benefited the community we serve greatly. We have been able to keep up with the demand and not only assure food security, but The Berry Man has delivered amazing quality produce. We are so grateful for Food Share

of Ventura County and Berryman Inc. A million Thank You's!"

LOCAL FARMWORKERS IN FOCUS AS RISK OF FOOD INSECURITY INCREASES

Food Share has received three significant donations to ensure the county's farmworker population and their families have access to adequate food. The funds will be used to purchase food, equipment, and supplies to help Food Share feed underserved farmworker communities.

One of the funding sources, administered through the California Association of Food Banks, will enable Food Share to further develop food distribution programs with other organizations trusted by the farm and agricultural worker communities.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, an estimated half a million agricultural and farm workers in California regularly experienced food insecurity. Now these workers, who have been deemed essential by the federal government, face even higher levels of food insecurity and risks to their health and well-being.

Over the past decade, Food Share has built collaborative relationships with organizations such as Cabrillo Economic Development Corporation, the Mixteco Indigena Community Organizing Project (MICOP), and the United Farm Workers (UFW) in addition to working with growers to provide field-direct distributions to ensure our local farmworker population is not overlooked.
